

Amazon forest fires in Brazil, monsoon fury in India

BRICS has vital common issues to tackle: Dr. Sirkali Siva Chidambaram

Chennai, Aug 6: BRICS Generation had organised an event in city to discuss various aspects of BRICS and the brainstorming session highlighted the scope and future of the BRICS Plus countries. Carnatic musician and medical doctor Padmasri Dr. Sirkali Siva Chidambaram delivered a speech emphasizing the role BRICS must play in protecting the environment and addressing deforestation, especially in countries like Brazil.

The Amazon wildfires and the Wayanad landslide are not isolated incidents but rather symptoms of a broader environmental crisis. The BRICS nations have an opportunity to demonstrate global leadership by taking decisive action to address these challenges. By working together, they can create a more sustainable and resilient future for both their citizens and the planet, he observed.

Following is the full text of his speech:

It is an honor to address this esteemed gathering at the BRICS Summit, where we unite our diverse nations with a shared vision for progress, prosperity, and sustainability. Today, I



wish to focus on a critical issue that transcends borders and affects us all: environmental management and disaster prevention, specifically regarding the recent Amazon wildfires and the devastating landslide in Wayanad.

My recent trip to the Amazon in Brazil was a profoundly eye-opening experience. Covering approximately 5.5 million square kilometers, the Amazon rainforest known as the "Lungs of our Earth", is a sprawling, breathtaking expanse of biodiversity, home to countless species and vital for regulating our global climate. The scale and beauty of this ecosystem are awe-inspiring, yet the visit

also highlighted a stark reality: the increasing frequency and intensity of wildfires, driven by deforestation and climate change.

Similarly, my visit to Wayanad before the recent landslide allowed me to witness the region's natural beauty and the vulnerability of its communities. Nestled in the Western Ghats, Wayanad is rich in lush greenery and diverse wildlife. Yet, even then, signs of environmental strain were apparent. The tragic landslide that has since struck Wayanad underscores the urgent need for effective environmental management to safeguard both people and nature.

Understanding the

Causes

The root causes of both the Amazon wildfires and the Wayanad landslide are interconnected. They stem from unsustainable land use practices, climate change, and inadequate disaster preparedness. Deforestation, agricultural expansion, and unplanned urbanization are contributing to increased fire risks and landslide susceptibility. Our collective challenge is to address these causes with effective solutions.

Preventive Measures and Environmental Management Systems To address these challenges, it is imperative that we implement comprehensive environmental

management systems and preventive measures. Here are key strategies we must adopt:

- 1. Strengthening Forest Protection Laws:** We need to enforce stricter regulations against illegal logging and land clearance. This includes increasing monitoring and surveillance efforts to ensure compliance.
- 2. Promoting Sustainable Agriculture:** Shifting towards sustainable agricultural practices can significantly reduce the risk of fires. Techniques such as agroforestry, conservation tillage, and the use of cover crops can help preserve soil health and reduce fire hazards.

3. Investing in Early Warning Systems:

Enhancing early warning systems for both wildfires and landslides is crucial. This involves using satellite technology and weather forecasting to predict and respond to potential disasters swiftly.

4. Community Engagement and Education:

Raising awareness among local communities about the importance of environmental conservation and disaster preparedness can play a critical role in prevention. Engaging communities in reforestation efforts and disaster response planning can build resilience.

5. International

Amazon crisis

The Amazon rainforest, often referred to as the "lungs of the planet," is under siege. Rampant deforestation and increasingly frequent wildfires are wreaking havoc on this vital ecosystem. These fires not only contribute to climate change but also lead to the loss of biodiversity and the displacement of indigenous communities.

Wayanad's wake-up call

The landslide in Wayanad, India, serves as a stark reminder of the vulnerability of human settlements to extreme weather events exacerbated by climate change. The tragedy highlighted the urgent need for improved disaster preparedness, early warning systems, and sustainable land use practices. Such incidents also underscore the interconnectedness of environmental challenges and their impact on human lives and livelihoods.

Collaboration: As BRICS nations, we have the opportunity—and indeed the responsibility—to lead by example. We should collaborate on research and technology development, share best practices, and provide support to one another in combating environmental threats. This could include joint research initiatives on climate resilience and funding for sustainable development projects.

6. Implementing Green Infrastructure: Developing green infrastructure, such as rain gardens, permeable pavements, and urban green spaces, can mitigate the impacts of heavy rainfall and reduce the risk of landslides. As BRICS nations, we
